Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

One of the most difficult duties of a disciple is to follow the command of Jesus to spread the gospel to all nations. (Lk 24:47, Mk 116:15, Mt 28:19) I think one reason may be that we don't feel we have the authority to tell someone else what to believe. Most of us don't think we know the gospel well enough to preach it. Or we are so afraid of offending atheists, that we use that fear as an excuse to say nothing. But being a disciple means following Jesus. The gospel this Sunday mentions twice that Jesus taught with more authority than any of religious leaders of Israel. So how can we get such authority?

First, Jesus didn't get his authority from winning a Messiah election. And he didn't threaten people with thunderbolts and lightning. He certainly didn't impress people by saying what they wanted to hear. He spoke the truth that he heard from his Father. His two main actions in his ministry were curing and forgiving people. Since the Jews thought sickness was a punishment for sins, by curing the sick and forgiving sins, Jesus showed that God loves even sinners. And those actions showed that Jesus got authority from his Father.

"But you still haven't answered the question: How do we get that authority?" We get it from the Holy Spirit, in Baptism and Confirmation. And like an athlete, who may be born with strength and abilities, yet has to workout and practice to be any good, we still need to grow in that authority. One way is to read the scriptures and pray with them, so that we get to know God through his Word and begin to listen to him in our prayers. We can consciously decide to see God in other people, not just those we love, but everyone, even the ones who annoy us. (And especially the ones who challenge us to be more loving, patient and forgiving.) Most parishes have programs that encourage sharing your faith, such as RCIA, Christ Renews his Parish, etc. And of course, the Eucharist and other sacraments strengthen God's life in us. You'll know you have that authority when you can talk about your faith with confidence instead of hesitation, because you will be speaking from experience, not second hand knowledge.

St. Joseph's Corner

Once again, this week, we will focus on holding what keeps us from God at bay. We continue to address this theme because it continues to be an issue in our lives.



Throughout our lives, we realize that time is the most precious resource we have and that, precisely, its scarcity makes it precious. There are many demands on our time, more so now than ever.

In St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, he points out the anxieties married men and women face (1 Corinthians 7:32-35). At least at the beginning of scripture, it seems that St. Paul is calling us, both men and women, to be or remain unmarried. However, at the end of the passage, it is clear that St. Paul is merely pointing out the reality of family life—something to which all families can relate.

For our own sake and for our salvation, St. Paul implores us to keep God first in our lives and to live a life centered on Christ.

"If today you hear His voice, harden not your hearts."

Every time I encounter this particular responsorial psalm, I'm reminded of a Homily given by Father Bruce Wren, L.C. Though he gives credit to another priest's homily, I will always distinctly credit him with the advice he shared.

"'If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts'" (Ps 95:1-2, 6-7, 7-9), he states, and then follows with, "and if you don't hear his voice, you better find out why."

We acknowledge St. John the Baptist as the last prophet, but God's promise of prophecy delivered by Moses (Dt 18:15-20) continues just as Jesus's mission to bring the faithful to the Father (John 14:6) continues. Through prophecy, God reveals His will for us and our lives, and today, God's prophecy is revealed through Jesus by the Holy Spirit. In today's Gospel, we hear that the people were amazed and astonished by Jesus, His new teachings, and His authority.

Hardened Hearts Experience No Amazement

As Fathers and Husbands, as leaders of the domestic church and in our communities, we must keep our families and all those we serve open to the amazement at the kingdom, the power, and the glory of God.

The path is simple, though not easy. Our everyday lives are occupied with tasks and responsibilities that don't bring us to God. We must prioritize God above all else, open our hearts to the Lord, and let him reveal His will. Only then can we help our families open their hearts to the Lord, be in awe of Him, and be open to the newness of God's revelations. Through this awe of God, we can abandon our anxieties and adhere ourselves "to the Lord without distraction."
