## St. Joseph's Corner

On this last Sunday of Lent, we celebrate Palm Sun day, a time of joy and solemn reflection. Our Lord's Passion begins with His triumphant entry into Jerusalem.

In the biblical narrative, we witness Jesus's humble procession through the city, as he is greeted by crowds laying palm branches before him and proclaiming "Hosanna"—in Hebrew, a cry for divine help, or literally "Save." Hosanna, from Hebrew through Greek and Latin before finally being translated into English, became an exclamation of praise.

In welcoming Jesus with this cry, the crowd acknowledged Jesus as the embodiment of God's saving presence among them. He wasn't a political figure or military leader; He was the incarnate Son of God, the Savior whose mission transcended earthly kingdoms and temporal concerns.

Yet, amidst the grandeur surrounding Jesus as he walked through the gates of the holy city lies a profound lesson in humility, service, and selflessness. This lesson may have easily gone unnoticed amongst the fanfare, but it becomes undeniably clear upon careful reflection.

While we should always try to follow Jesus' example in our own lives, we know that we will always fall short. Still, we are called to walk the path of humility, service, and selflessness. For inspiration and encouragement, our Lord gives us none other than his earthly father, St. Joseph.

While St. Joseph's story takes a backseat to Jesus's ministry, his pivotal role as Guardian of the Redeemer cannot be overstated. As Catholic fathers and husbands, we are called to emulate St. Joseph's virtues of faith, obedience, and steadfast love within our own families.

#### **Our Call as Husbands and Fathers**

As Husbands and Fathers, we should draw inspiration from the exemplary life of St. Joseph and renew our commitment to our role as head of the domestic Church—the spiritual leaders and guardians of our families—where Christ's presence is felt every day.

We must commit ourselves to prayer and pray for God's guidance and strength to fulfill our vocations. Let us strive to be faithful stewards of our families and to foster an environment where faith flourishes, virtues are cultivated, and love abounds.

Here are some ideas to incorporate the Triduum and the Easter season into our Domestic Churches. Thanks to Joyce Donahue for sharing her ideas.

Make the Triduum a priority. Be present in the liturgical celebrations of the Triduum, from sundown on Holy Thursday until sundown on Easter Sunday. Holy Week is the most important time in the life of our faith as we accompany Jesus through his Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Fast from those things that distract you from being present to Jesus.

Make Holy Thursday special. Whether you can be in church or not on Holy Thursday night, try a family foot-washing ceremony followed by a quiet meal, perhaps beginning with breaking and sharing bread.

Experience the Passion. Wear red on Good Friday in solidarity with the suffering of Jesus. If you are unable to attend a Passion service, pray the Stations of the Cross or meditate on artwork or music that represents the suffering and Death of Jesus on the Cross.

Make the Easter Vigil a priority. Holy Saturday is a day of preparation for the Easter feast. We have the traditional blessing of Easter baskets, be sure to have your baskets ready that morning. Cook, clean, and prepare your Easter dinner as much as possible on Saturday so that on Easter Sunday you can concentrate on Jesus more and worry less about preparations. At sundown, the most wonderful liturgy of the year begins with the blessing and lighting of the paschal candle. Experience the story of Salvation, and the celebration of the Resurrection. If you are unable to be at church that night, light a candle and read as the story of the Resurrection shift from sorrow to joy. On Easter morning, we begin a new day, leaving Lenten sorrow and drabness behind. Put on those new clothes, reminiscent of your new life in Christ at Baptism.

Fill your house with music, light, and flowers, and let the feasting begin! This is when we claim our identity as an Easter people. As Missionary Disciples, we must make time for him in his Word and the Eucharist.

## HOW THE PONTIFICAL GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION IS USED



What is the Pontifical Good Friday Collection?

#### It supports the people of the Holy Land and the pilgrims that visit.

At the request of the Holy Father, the Franciscans of the Holy Land promote the Pontifical Good Friday Collection in the United States and other parts of the world. Funds are distributed at the direction of the Vatican's Congregation for the Oriental Churches. A portion of the funds are directly allocated to the educational and ecclesial projects in the Middle East. The rest of the funds collected in the United States and a number of other countries support the ministries and programs entrusted by the Holy See to the Holy Land Franciscans. The Franciscans have served in the Holy Land for 800 years.

The Pontifical Good Friday Collection provides, Humanitarian, Liturgical, Pastoral, Archaeological, Charitable, Educational services, as well as care for the Holy Places.
