Dinner Conversation

One of the best things we can do for our children's religious formation is to remind them of where their journey began, so talk about their own Baptism. Perhaps you have pictures from your children's baptism or the white garment and candle given at the celebration of the sacrament. Talk about the special day they were Baptized.

1. What is the date of their.....and your Baptism?
2. Do you remember who your Godparents are? Let them know why you chose their Godparents.
3. Who performed the Sacrament, and in which Church?
4. Was there a celebration after their Baptism?
5. Discuss and/or research the white garment, candle, Baptismal rite.

FRIENDS

Celebrate your baptism day - with friends! Do you know the date of your own baptism? If not, this would be a great time to find out. Mark your calendar to celebrate the anniversary of each family member's baptism each year as your special moment when God showed the world that they belong to him! Be sure to invite grandparents and godparents if you are able - even if you have to do it virtually - they can tell the story of what happened that day and who was there. If you have other close friends of the family, be sure to invite them as well. Adults - if your parents and godparents are alive, invite them. If not, make prayer for them part of your celebration.
