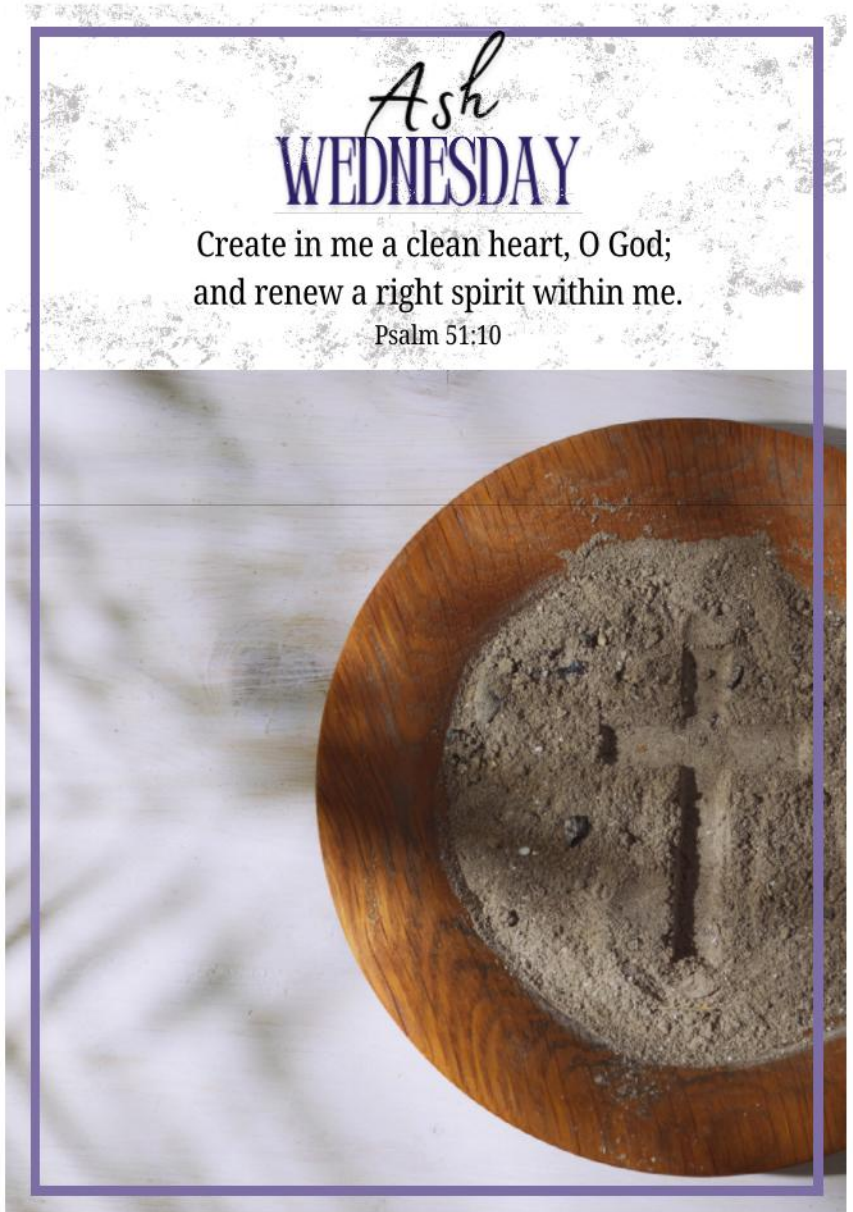

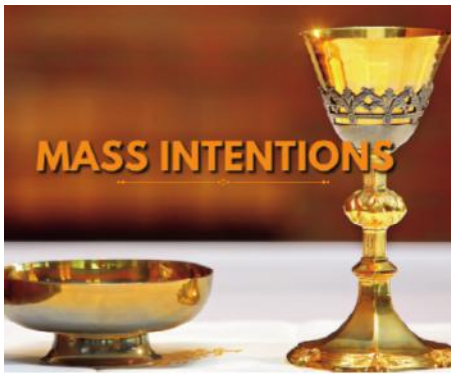

LENT IS MARKED WITH PRAYER, FASTING, ABSTINENCE, AND PENANCE

WHAT IS ABSTINENCE?

It is refraining from eating the meat of mammals and fowl. However, fish and other marine animals are allowed. It is mandatory for Catholics 15 and older to abstain during Lent on Fridays and Ash Wednesday. Inability to abstain due to medical reasons is allowed.



WHAT IS FASTING?

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting. When fasting, you are permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal. Fasting is obligatory from age 18 until age 59. If you are unable to fast, it is encouraged to do another act of penance.

What We Can Do For Lent

This Wednesday begins the Season of Lent, and our preparation for Easter. As Catholic Christians, we prepare ourselves during Lent by fasting, praying and giving alms... ie giving of ourselves to others.

Jesus came to serve, not to be served.

We can easily incorporate giving of ourselves (almsgiving) into our lives. If we go outside of ourselves during Lent, it will become second nature to us, and we will continue our almsgiving beyond Lent. Some examples of putting our faith into action by incorporating almsgiving into our daily lives are:

- Volunteer for one of our parish ministries, become a catechist in our religious education program.
- Instead of watching tv, spend family time by playing a game together, or praying together as a family. Or watch a faith based tv show, such as The Chosen, and discuss the show with your family.
- Writing letters or sending cards to family members you don't often see. Make cards for residents in nursing homes to help brighten their day.
- Giving someone a compliment each day, or simply smiling at a stranger....go out of your way to do so.

Let's journey through Lent together, making ourselves a better version of "us" by becoming more giving.

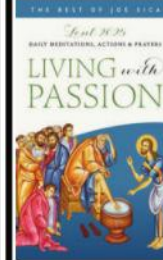

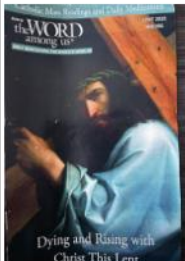

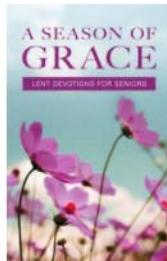

Bishops Hick's letter regarding the Second Collection on Ash Wednesday March 5th



**RESTORE THE CHURCH
BUILD THE FUTURE**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

For more than 40 years, and in some countries more than 70 years, communism ruled Central and Eastern European countries and the Soviet Union's many republics. The Soviet Union stretched from Eastern Europe across central Asia and beyond to the Pacific Ocean. One of its former republics is Tajikistan, in central Asia. Bordering China to the east and Afghanistan to the south, Tajikistan is today the poorest of the former Soviet republics.

The country's economic challenges—along with a population that today is 98% Muslim—make Tajikistan a true mission country for the Church, because Catholics are few and needs are great. In fact, the Church's presence is so small that the Tajikistan Church is not part of a diocese with its own bishop but is an independent mission of the pope, administered by priests from the Institute of the Incarnate Word, a missionary order from Argentina. Along with the institute's order of sisters, the Servants of the Lord and the Virgin of Matará, these priests faithfully serve the pastoral needs of the people through education and accompaniment. Despite its small size and relative poverty, this community has fostered the first two priestly vocations and ordinations of two Tajik men, as well as the religious vocation of a Tajik woman who professed perpetual vows with the sisters.

With critical support from the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe, the sisters continue their mission by educating the children and providing them with instruction, school supplies, school uniforms, and the food they need to develop intellectually, spiritually, physically, and socially. Guided by their faith and this material support, the sisters witness to Christ's love while carrying out their works of mercy. You can participate in their success by donating to this special collection when it is taken up in our diocese, either by contributing at Mass or through your parish's e-giving platform. #iGiveCatholicTogether also accepts funds online for the collection.

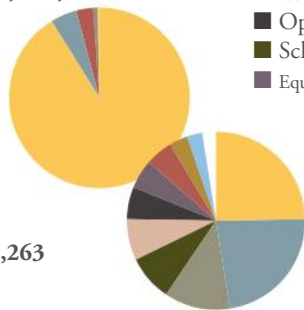

St. Joseph's Corner

"No good tree bears bad fruit, nor does a bad tree bear good fruit" (Luke 6:43).

If we desire to bear good fruit, we must first cultivate our inner lives—pruning away what is unhealthy and nurturing what is virtuous. Too often, we focus on external factors as the primary obstacles to our spiritual growth: difficult circumstances, the behavior of others, or challenges beyond our control. While these struggles are real, Jesus' words shift our attention inward, reminding us that the fruit we produce is ultimately a reflection of the state of our hearts.

Just as a tree cannot blame the weather for its lack of fruitfulness, we cannot attribute our spiritual stagnation solely to external conditions. The good or bad fruit we bear is rooted in what we allow to take hold within us. If we wish to produce abundant and lasting fruit, we must be willing to undergo pruning—an often uncomfortable process but one that is necessary for growth and renewal.

The Call to Prune Ourselves for Lent

Lent is a season of purification and renewal, a time to examine our hearts and invite God to shape us. It is an opportunity to remove distractions, sinful tendencies, and attachments that hinder our relationship with Him. At the same time, it calls us to nourish virtues that align our hearts more closely with Christ.

Pope Benedict XVI expresses this beautifully in *Spe Salvi*:
The human being needs purification and maturation. He needs the contradiction in his soul to be burned away. He needs the compulsion of falsehood to be eliminated from him. What remains is the fully realized human being, the human being who is no longer subject to contradictions and who, by being fully open to God, is fully open to his fellow human beings." (*Spe Salvi*, 47)

Just as a tree must be pruned to bear good fruit, we, too, must be purified—removing sin, selfishness, and falsehood so that we may fully open ourselves to God's grace and become who we are called to be.

Trusting the Gardener

Pruning is not a punishment but an act of love and careful cultivation. A skilled gardener does not cut away branches arbitrarily or out of cruelty but with precision and purpose—removing what is dead, diseased, or unfruitful so that new life can flourish. Likewise, God's work in our lives is always for our good, even when it requires sacrifice, discomfort, or letting go of things we once held dear. When He prunes us, He is not diminishing us but preparing us to grow stronger, healthier, and more fruitful in His grace.

This process often feels painful because it challenges our attachments, our pride, and the areas where we have become spiritually complacent. But pruning is necessary if we are to bear fruit that endures. If we refuse to let go of what stifles our spiritual growth—sinful habits, worldly distractions, or self-centered attitudes—then we risk becoming like the withered branches that Jesus warns will be thrown into the fire (John 15:6). Yet when we submit to God's refining work, we open ourselves to an abundance of grace, allowing Him to shape us into true disciples whose lives radiate His love, truth, and mercy.

This Lent, let us embrace the pruning process with trust and humility. May we surrender to the hands of the Divine Gardener, who knows exactly where to cut and when to cultivate. As we allow Him to work in us, may we remember that the fruit we bear is not for ourselves alone but for the glory of God and the good of others. Like a flourishing tree whose branches provide shade, shelter, and nourishment to those around it, may our lives become a witness of Christ's transformative power, bearing fruit that brings renewal to the world.
