



MESSAGE FOR LENT 2026 "LISTENING AND FASTING" POPE LEO XIV

As we begin our journey through this holy season of Lent, Pope Leo has offered some insights in his Lenten Message. His words challenge us to move beyond simple habits and toward a true change of heart.

Discovering Our True Hunger

The Holy Father recognizes that we fill our lives with constant noise and "spiritual junk food" to distract ourselves. He invites us to not only use fasting

physically, but also use it as a way to reveal our soul's true hunger. When we clear away the excess in our lives, we create the space to realize that we are hungering for God's presence.

A New Kind of Fast: Disarming Our Language

Pope Leo's message calls us to "disarm our language." He challenges us to fast from words that wound. Practicing this type of speech can include refraining from harsh words, rash judgments, and avoiding speaking ill of those who cannot defend themselves.

Instead we should choosing kindness and constructive dialogue over hostility within our families and across social media.

Listening as an Act of Charity

The Holy Father also reminds us that "listening is the first way we demonstrate our desire to enter into relationship." When we quiet our voices, we are better equipped to hear the movement of the Holy Spirit in Sacred Scripture and the "cry of the poor" in our own neighborhoods.

As a parish family, let us take these words to heart. May our fasting lead to a deeper hunger for the Gospel, and may our listening transform our community into a place of greater charity and peace.

What We Can Do For Lent

This is our first weekend in the Season of Lent. As Catholic Christians, we prepare ourselves during Lent by fasting, praying and giving alms...ie giving of ourselves to others.

Jesus came to serve, not to be served.

We can easily incorporate giving of ourselves (almsgiving) into our lives. If we go outside of ourselves during Lent, it will become second nature to us, and we will continue our almsgiving beyond Lent. Some examples of putting our faith into action by incorporating almsgiving into our daily lives are:

- Volunteer for one of our parish ministries, become a catechist in our religious education program.
- Instead of watching tv, spend family time by playing a game together, or praying together as a family. Or watch a faith based tv show, such as The Chosen, and discuss the show with your family.
- Writing letters or sending cards to family members you don't often see. Make cards for residents in nursing homes to help brighten their day. Bring the cards to the director of the facility and ask them to distribute.
- Giving someone a compliment each day, or simply smiling at a stranger...go out of your way to do so. Let's journey through Lent together, making ourselves a better version of "us" by becoming more giving.





St. Joseph's Corner

"If you are the Son of God..." (Mt 4:3). With this line, the enemy does not tempt Jesus to become something false; he tempts Him to become a different kind of Son. Each temptation is a redefinition of sonship. The command to turn stones into bread replaces reliance upon the Father with self-provision apart from Him. The invitation to throw Himself from the parapet replaces shared glory received in obedience with spectacle engineered to force recognition. And the offer of all the kingdoms of the world replaces filial trust and suffering fidelity with dominion seized without the Cross—glory without obedience, a kingdom without the cup.

The Church places this Gospel at the beginning of Lent not as history, but as a mirror. As we examine these temptations, we begin to recognize their hidden forms in our own lives—especially where they disguise themselves as righteous aims.

"One does not live by bread alone" But one does live by bread. The problem is not bread, nor the body. Jesus truly hungers after forty days in the desert. The question is not whether bread sustains life, but whether life originates from bread. The temptation is not to eat; it is to provide apart from the Father—to turn a legitimate need into an assertion of independence.

When Jesus answers, He quotes the Book of Deuteronomy. He recalls Israel in the wilderness, where God allowed His people to hunger and then fed them with manna—bread they could neither produce nor predict—"that He might make you know that man does not live by bread alone." The lesson was dependence. Israel survived not by ingenuity but by receiving what was given. In the same way, Christ refuses to secure His existence on His own terms.

The second temptation is more refined. The enemy quotes Scripture and proposes an act that appears to be trust: "He will command His angels concerning you." But trust is not the same as testing. To leap from the Temple would not have been confidence in the Father; it would have been a demand that the Father intervene. The Son does not compel protection; He receives it within obedience. Creating danger to require rescue is not faith. It is presumption.

Then comes the third temptation. The proposal is direct: "All these I will give you... if you will fall down and worship me." What makes it dangerous is its plausibility. The Son is destined to receive the nations. The Kingdom will be His. The enemy offers nothing imaginary. He offers the end—severed from the way.

This is the temptation to separate glory from obedience. To receive the crown without the Cross. To inherit the Kingdom without drinking the cup. The price seems small—one act of worship—but it strikes at the heart of sonship. The Son reigns because He obeys. His authority flows from communion with the Father.

This temptation presses against Christ's humanity. He has assumed a human will that naturally recoils from suffering. He knows the path before Him. One day He will pray, "If it be possible, let this cup pass," and yet say, "Not my will, but Yours be done." The desert offers what Gethsemane will refuse: authority without obedience unto death. But the Son does not grasp at glory. He receives it through fidelity—even to the Cross.

As we begin Lent, we are not undertaking a program of self-improvement but returning to sonship. The desert reveals the subtle distortions within our will—the desire to provide apart from prayer, to demand validation, to secure influence through compromise.

The Son reigns because He obeys. If we would share in His glory, we must share in His way. Let us seek not the crown without the Cross, but the Cross that leads to true glory.

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION



Baptism: Baptisms are scheduled on the second Sunday of each month. Polish Baptisms are at 1:00 p.m., and English Baptisms are at 1:30 p.m. Please contact the Faith Formation Office before booking a venue for the celebration. Parents must be registered with our parish. Both sponsors must be over 16 years old, with at least one being a practicing Catholic.



Marriage: The bride and groom should be active members of our parish. The couple should contact the Faith Formation Office at least six months in advance to schedule their marriage, allowing for adequate preparation. Schedule the church date for your marriage before securing your venue.



Funerals: The family of the deceased will coordinate with the chosen funeral home to make the arrangements. The funeral home will then contact the Faith Formation Office at Our Mother of Good Counsel (OMGC) to notify us about the upcoming funeral Mass. We (OMGC) will get in touch with the family and work together to organize the funeral liturgy.



Eucharist for the Homebound and Hospitalized: If you are unable to attend Mass please contact the Parish Office for the Sacraments of the Eucharist. Our Homebound ministry would be happy to assist you.



Anointing of the Sick & Hospital Visits: Please contact the Parish Office if your loved one requires an anointing. Please do not wait until death is imminent to request anointing, as it may take some time to find a priest for the sacrament.



Religious Education: We offer religious education classes for grades 1-8. Call the Faith Formation Office for more information. Classes meet Wednesday, 6:00-7:30PM September through March.
