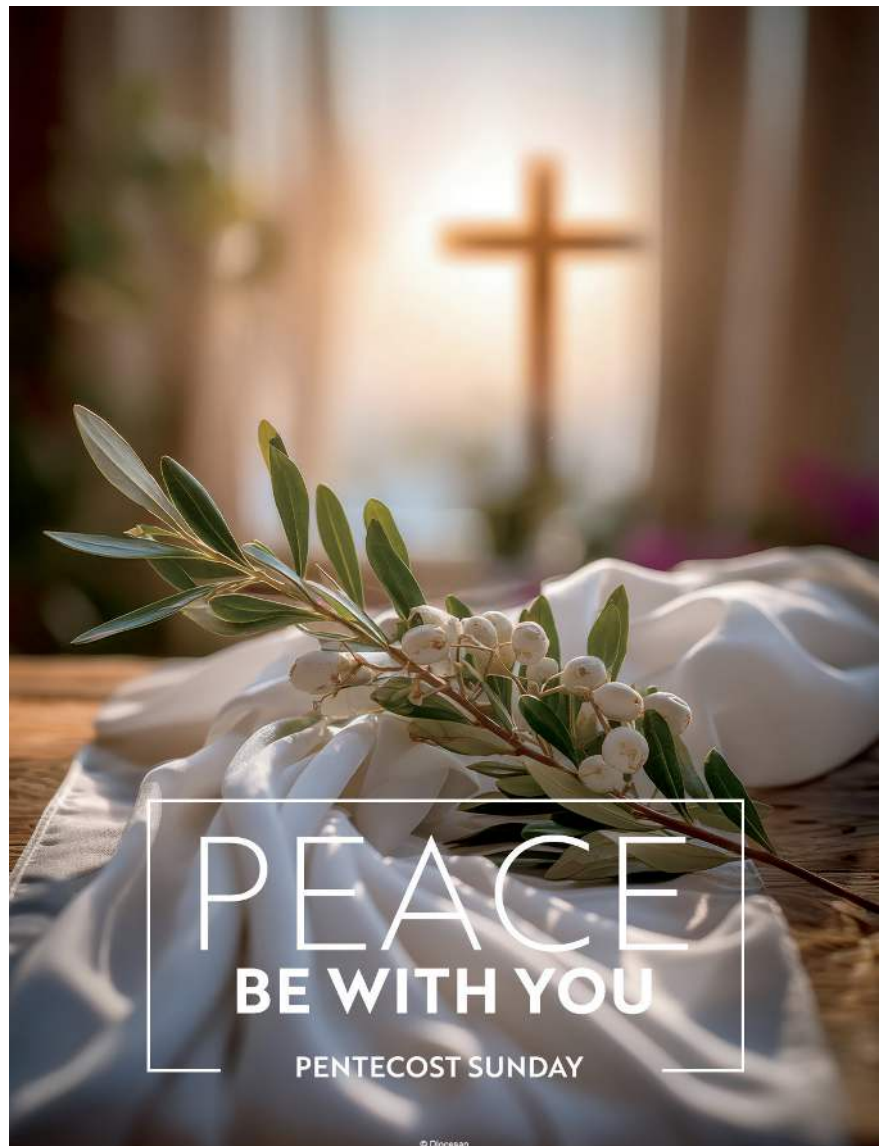

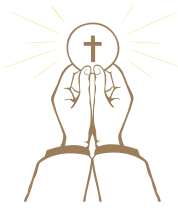

A WORD FROM FR. GREG

Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, we give thanks for the gift of the Holy Spirit and for the Lord's abiding presence in His Church. In Acts of the Apostles, we hear how the Spirit descended upon the apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary as they prayed with the disciples. In wind and fire, Christ's promise was fulfilled, and the Church was strengthened for her mission. Pentecost reminds us that this is not only a mystery of the past, but a living grace for the Church today. The risen Lord continues to guide, strengthen, and send us forth to live the Gospel with faith and love.

The signs of Pentecost—wind, fire, and many tongues—reveal the Holy Spirit's power to renew and unite the People of God. In the psalm we pray, "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth," and that prayer is fitting for our parish, our families, and our world. The same Spirit continues to dwell within the Church, strengthening us through sacramental grace and filling us with His gifts. As Saint Paul reminds us, we are one in Christ through the one Spirit, and each of us is called to serve with humility and love. May the Lord renew our hearts and make our parish a joyful witness to the Gospel.

This feast also reminds us of the Holy Spirit's presence in the Church's sacred liturgy. At every Mass, the Lord gathers us as one family of faith, speaks to us in His Word, and nourishes us with His Body and Blood. The Holy Spirit opens our hearts in prayer and sends us forth to carry Christ's love into our homes and community. In this way, Pentecost remains a living grace in the Church's worship and mission.

Last weekend, our parish had another reason to rejoice as the students from King Casimir School received their First Holy Communion. On this Pentecost weekend, we look forward to seeing all the children who received the Eucharistic Lord for the first time in recent weeks come to Mass and continue to nourish themselves on his body and blood. May the Holy Spirit fill them with reverence, joy, and a lasting love for the Mass. I ask our parish family to keep these children and their families in prayer, that they may grow ever closer to Christ and His Church.

As we celebrate this holy feast, let us turn to the Lord with renewed confidence and pray: "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth." May the Holy Spirit descend anew upon our parish, deepen our love for Christ, strengthen our families, and help each of us to live our faith with greater devotion and joy.

Drodzy Parafianie,

Celebrując Uroczystość Zesłania Ducha Świętego, dziękujemy za dar Ducha Świętego oraz za nieustanną obecność Pana w Jego Kościele. W Dziejach Apostolskich słyszymy, jak Duch Święty zstąpił na apostołów oraz Najświętszą Maryję Pannę, gdy razem z uczniami trwali na modlitwie. W wicherze i ogniu wypełniła się obietnica Chrystusa, a Kościół został umocniony do swojej misji. Pięćdziesiątnica przypomina nam, że nie jest to jedynie tajemnica przeszłości, lecz żywa łaska obecna w Kościele także dzisiaj. Zmartwychwstały Pan nadal prowadzi, umacnia i posyła nas, abyśmy żyli Ewangelią z wiarą i miłością.

Znaki Pięćdziesiątnicy — wiatr, ogień i różne języki — ukazują moc Ducha Świętego, który odnawia i jednoczy Lud Boży. W psalmie modlimy się: „Panie, ześlij Ducha Twego i odnów oblicze ziemi”, a ta modlitwa jest szczególnie odpowiednia dla naszej parafii, naszych rodzin i całego świata. Ten sam Duch nieustannie mieszka w Kościele, umacniając nas przez łaskę sakramentów i napełniając swoimi darami. Jak przypomina nam św. Paweł, wszyscy stanowimy jedno w Chrystusie przez jednego Ducha, a każdy z nas jest powołany do służby z pokorą i miłością. Niech Pan odnowi nasze serca i uczyni naszą parafię radosnym świadkiem Ewangelii.

To święto przypomina nam również o obecności Ducha Świętego w świętej liturgii Kościoła. Podczas każdej Mszy Świętej Pan gromadzi nas jako jedną rodzinę wiary, przemawia do nas w swoim Słowie i karmi nas swoim Ciałem i Krwią. Duch Święty otwiera nasze serca na modlitwę i posyła nas, abyśmy nieśli miłość Chrystusa do naszych domów i wspólnoty. W ten sposób Pięćdziesiątnica pozostaje żywą łaską w liturgii i misji Kościoła.

W miniony weekend nasza parafia miała kolejny powód do radości, gdy uczniowie Szkoły Króla Kazimierza przyjęli swoją Pierwszą Komunię Świętą. W ten weekend Zesłania Ducha Świętego z radością oczekujemy obecności wszystkich dzieci, które w ostatnich tygodniach po raz pierwszy przyjęły Pana Jezusa w Eucharystii, aby nadal umacniały się Jego Ciałem i Krwią. Niech Duch Święty napelni je czcią, radością i trwałą miłością do Mszy Świętej. Proszę naszą rodzinę parafialną o modlitwę za te dzieci i ich rodziny, aby wzrastały coraz bliżej Chrystusa i Jego Kościoła.

Celebrując tę świętą uroczystość, zwróćmy się do Pana z odnowioną ufnością i módlmy się: „Panie, ześlij Ducha Twego i odnów oblicze ziemi”. Niech Duch Święty na nowo zstąpi na naszą parafię, pogłębi naszą miłość do Chrystusa, umocni nasze rodziny i pomoże każdemu z nas żyć wiarą z większym oddaniem i radością.

Happy Birthday to The Catholic Church

We celebrate the Feast of Pentecost this weekend. It is the day that the Apostles received the Holy Spirit, and then went out and preached The Gospel. The word "Pentecost" is Greek in origin and means 50th day. We celebrate Pentecost 50 days after Easter. As Catholics, we celebrate Pentecost as the birth of our Church.

We know that the Apostles were gathered in an upper room on that first Pentecost. A great wind blew in and flames appeared as tongues of fire above the heads of those present. The Holy Spirit came upon those gathered and they began speaking in tongues. Although there was no common language, everyone understood each other

Because the Apostles received the Holy Spirit, they then went out and brought The Gospel to others.

As Confirmed Catholic Christians, we all have received the Holy Spirit. We too, can be like the Apostles and bring The Gospel to others. How? We can live as Jesus taught us. We can become a catechist in our religious education program to share our faith with others. We can become involved in our various Mass ministries, Eucharistic Ministers, lectors, sacristans, ushers...our young people can become altar servers. We will grow in our own faith life as we become involved in sharing our gift of faith. Let us be like the Apostles after receiving The Holy Spirit that first Pentecost and bring our faith to others.



Titles of Mary: Mary, Mother of the Church

Among the many titles we give
The Blessed Virgin Mary, one close
to our everyday lives is
Mater Ecclesiae, or
"Mary, Mother of the Church."

Her motherhood extends
beyond the nativity in Bethlehem.
This title declares that we are a
spiritual family guided by the
same loving mother who brought
the Savior into the world.



Mary's role as mother to all Christians was **established in the agony of the crucifixion**. As Jesus was dying, He looked down at Mary and the Beloved Disciple, John. He said to her, "Woman, behold your son," and to John, "Behold your mother" (John 19:26-27). In this final act, John represented all believers. Jesus formally entrusted His mother to the Church, and the Church to His mother.

Her motherhood was then fully realized at **Pentecost**. Just as the Holy Spirit came to her at the Annunciation to conceive Christ, she was present when the Holy Spirit descended in fire to breathe life into His Mystical Body, the Church. This formal title is a recent gift. It was officially proclaimed by Pope Paul VI at the close of the Second Vatican Council. In 2018, Pope Francis took this a step further by establishing the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church. **This feast is celebrated every year on the Monday immediately following Pentecost**

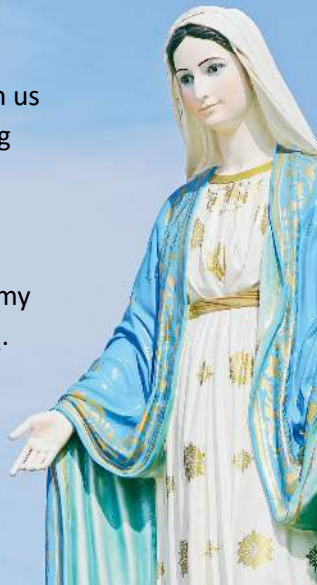

MEMORIAL DAY FROM A CATHOLIC PERSPECTIVE

While often celebrated with barbecues as the unofficial start of summer, Memorial Day is a solemn holiday dedicated to honoring the men and women who lost their lives serving in our armed forces. As Catholics, our faith teaches us how to give back to those who gave everything to protect our freedoms.

Here are a few ways to honor the fallen this holiday weekend:

1. Pray for the Dead: Praying for the departed is a spiritual work of mercy. Consider praying a Rosary for the repose of these souls.

2. Visit a Cemetery: Take a walk through a local cemetery. When you see an American flag at a veteran's grave-site, pray for them by name. You can use this simple prayer:

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

3. Observe the 3 PM Remembrance: The National Moment of Remembrance asks Americans to pause for a minute of silence at 3:00 PM local time. Since 3:00 PM is also the hour of Divine Mercy, elevate this moment by praying a Divine Mercy Chaplet for our fallen heroes.

We give thanks, Lord, for the blessing of our freedoms. We pray for the men and women who have died to protect them, and for the families they have left behind.

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION



Baptism: Baptisms are scheduled on the second Sunday of each month. Polish Baptisms are at 1:00 p.m., and English Baptisms are at 1:30 p.m. Please contact the Faith Formation Office before booking a venue for the celebration. Parents must be registered with our parish. Both sponsors must be over 16 years old, with at least one being a practicing Catholic.



Marriage: The bride and groom should be active members of our parish. The couple should contact the Faith Formation Office at least six months in advance to schedule their marriage, allowing for adequate preparation. Schedule the church date for your marriage before securing your venue.



Funerals: The family of the deceased will coordinate with the chosen funeral home. The funeral home will then contact us at Our Mother of Good Counsel about the upcoming funeral Mass. We will then get in touch with the family to organize the funeral liturgy.



Eucharist for the Homebound and Hospitalized: If you are unable to attend Mass please contact the Parish Office for the Sacraments of the Eucharist. Our Homebound ministry would be happy to assist you.



Anointing of the Sick & Hospital Visits: Please contact the Parish Office if your loved one requires an anointing. Please do not wait until death is imminent to request anointing, as it may take some time to find a priest for the sacrament.



Religious Education: We offer religious education classes for grades 1-8. Call the Faith Formation Office for more information. Classes meet Wednesday, 6:00-7:30PM September through March.
