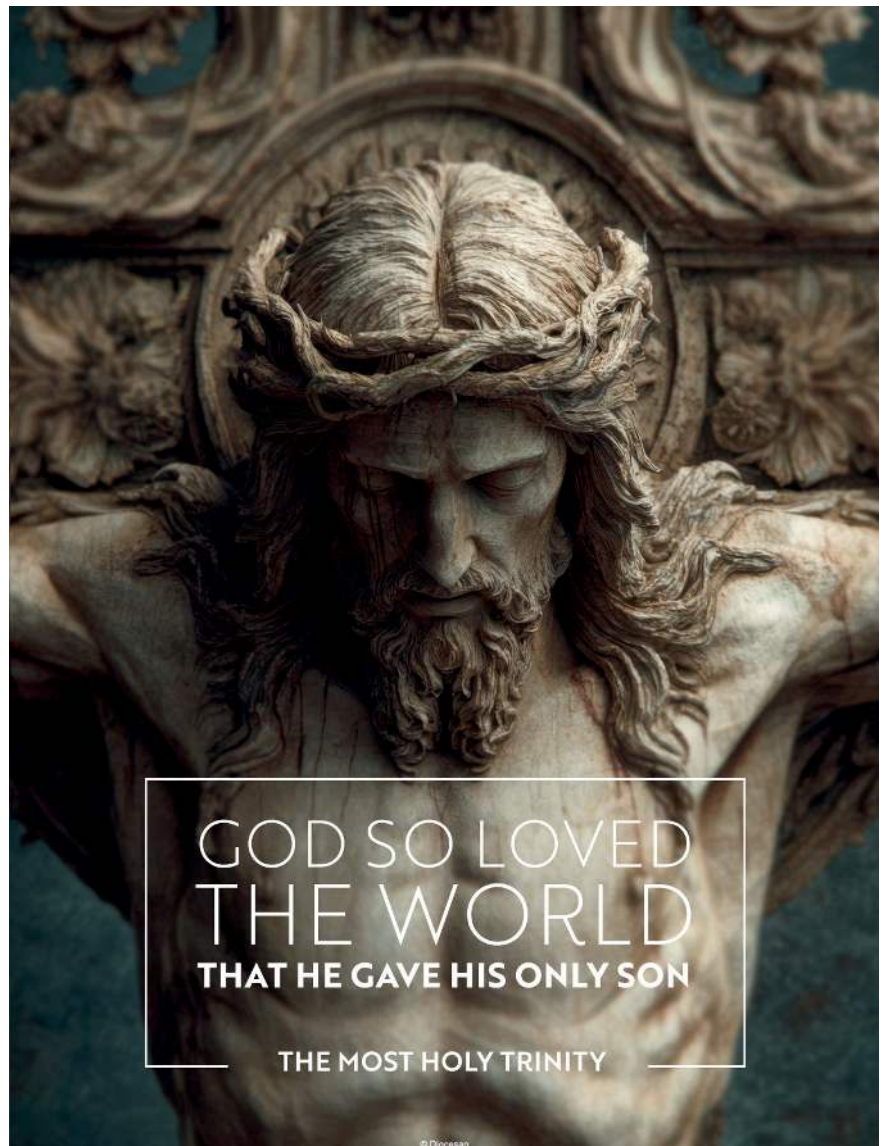

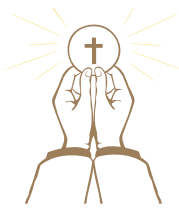

A WORD FROM FR. GREG

Honoring the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Dear Parishioners,

As you may know, the Catholic Church dedicates each month to a spiritual theme to help the faithful grow closer to God, His Son, and the Saints. As June begins, we start a new devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Jesus had a human heart that, on the cross, was pierced out of love for us, and we are reminded of His infinite and burning love for humanity. We are also asked to return His love by living with compassionate hearts ourselves.

To help us honor this dedication, we will be starting devotions to the Sacred Heart of Jesus throughout the month of June. I invite you to join us for this special prayer time immediately following the Thursday 8:00 AM Mass and the Sunday 12:00 PM Mass.

During this time, we will come together to pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This litany is a beautiful prayer that names the many attributes of Jesus' heart, such as the "glowing furnace of charity," the "abyss of all virtues," and "patient and rich in mercy."

The first invocation of this prayer was made in 1681 by a Jesuit priest, and it has since been expanded. It contains exactly thirty-three invocations to the Sacred Heart, honoring the thirty-three years of Jesus' earthly life.

As we focus on the Sacred Heart, June is also a perfect time to reflect on the First Friday Devotion. In a series of visions in the 1670s, Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque and asked for a devotion of reparation to His Sacred Heart. Jesus assured all who completed this devotion will experience His mercy and not die without His grace.

If you would like to participate in the First Friday Devotions, the requirements are to attend Mass and receive Communion on the first Friday of the month for nine consecutive First Fridays. The Communion must be offered in honor of, and in reparation to, the Sacred Heart of Jesus for all the world's offenses against it. The last requirement is, as always, that you must be in a state of grace when receiving the Eucharist.

We hope you can join us in praying the Litany to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, but if you have a scheduling conflict, I highly recommend praying it at home.

Jesus, meek and humble of heart,
make our hearts like unto Thine!

Drodzy Parafianie,

Jak być może wiecie, Kościół katolicki dedykuje każdy miesiąc szczególnej tematyce duchowej, aby pomóc wiernym zbliżyć się do Boga, Jego Syna oraz Świętych. Wraz z początkiem czerwca rozpoczynamy nabożeństwo do Najświętszego Serca Pana Jezusa. Jezus miał ludzkie Serce, które na krzyżu zostało przebite z miłości do nas, przypominając nam o Jego nieskończonej i płonącej miłości do całej ludzkości. Jesteśmy również wezwani, aby odwzajemniać tę miłość, żyjąc sercami pełnymi współczucia.

Aby uczcić to nabożeństwo, przez cały miesiąc czerwiec będziemy odprawiać nabożeństwa do Najświętszego Serca Pana Jezusa. Serdecznie zapraszam do wspólnej modlitwy bezpośrednio po Mszy Świętej w czwartek o godzinie 8:00 rano oraz po niedzielnej Mszy Świętej o godzinie 12:00.

W tym czasie będziemy wspólnie odmawiać Litanię do Najświętszego Serca Pana Jezusa. Jest to piękna modlitwa, która wymienia liczne przymioty Serca Jezusowego, takie jak „gorejące ognisko miłości”, „głębia wszelkich cnót” oraz „cierpliwe i bogate w miłosierdzie”.

Pierwsza wersja tej modlitwy została ułożona w 1681 roku przez kapłana jezuitę, a później litania była stopniowo rozszerzana. Zawiera dokładnie trzydzieści trzy wezwania do Najświętszego Serca Jezusowego, nawiązujące do trzydziestu trzech lat ziemskiego życia Jezusa.

Rozważając Najświętsze Serce Jezusa, czerwiec jest również doskonałym czasem, aby przypomnieć sobie o nabożeństwie Pierwszych Piątków Miesiąca. W serii objawień w latach siedemdziesiątych XVII wieku Jezus ukazał się św. Małgorzacie Marii Alacoque i poprosił o nabożeństwo wynagradzające Jego Najświętszemu Sercu. Jezus obiecał wszystkim, którzy odprawią to nabożeństwo, że doświadczą Jego miłosierdzia i nie umrą bez Jego łaski.

Jeśli chcielibyście uczestniczyć w nabożeństwie Pierwszych Piątków, warunkiem jest uczestnictwo we Mszy Świętej i przyjęcie Komunii Świętej w pierwszy piątek miesiąca przez dziewięć kolejnych pierwszych piątków. Komunia Święta powinna być ofiarowana ku czci oraz jako wynagrodzenie Najświętszemu Sercu Jezusa za wszystkie zniewagi i grzechy świata. Ostatnim warunkiem jest, jak zawsze, pozostawanie w stanie łaski uświęcającej podczas przyjmowania Eucharystii.

Mamy nadzieję, że dołączycie do nas we wspólnej modlitwie Litanią do Najświętszego Serca Pana Jezusa. Jeśli jednak nie możecie uczestniczyć osobiście, gorąco zachęcam do odmawiania jej w domu.

Celebrating the Feast of the Visitation



Every year on May 31st, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Visitation. A newly pregnant Mary traveled to Judea to assist her older cousin, Elizabeth, miraculously expecting a child of her own.

In the Gospel of Luke, the moment Mary's greeting reached Elizabeth's ears, the infant in Elizabeth's womb leaped for joy. Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, recognized the significance of her young cousin's arrival and exclaimed, **"Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!"**

In response, Mary offered the Magnificat, one of the most beautiful canticles of praise in scripture: **"My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior."**

The Visitation is a blueprint for community life.

Charity: Mary's first instinct upon receiving news of Elizabeth's pregnancy was to travel a difficult road to help.

Bringing Christ to Others: Mary carried Jesus into Elizabeth's home. How are we carrying that same presence into our own neighborhoods, workplaces, and families?

Joy: The joy of these two women was magnified by their shared moment. True community thrives when we celebrate each other's blessings.

As we close out May, the Visitation reminds us that faith is meant to be active. Whether it's reaching out to a neighbor, volunteering time, or offering a joyful greeting, we are all called to make our own "visitations" every day.

Solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity

Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to remember what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity, one God in three Persons. The Gospel for this Solemnity is taken from the Gospel of St. John

This Sunday and next Sunday are designated as solemnities, which are special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity—one God in three persons—a Triune God.

Since we are all Baptized in the name of the Trinity, it is our collective mission to evangelize and teach through our example. We can put our faith into action in our domestic churches and then reach out to our neighborhoods and communities.

How? See how to begin below.

Becoming Missionary Disciples

By virtue of our Baptism, we are all called to be Missionary Disciples. Some examples are.....

- Saying grace before meals**, where ever you are. Invite your meal companions to thank God with you.
- Taking time to play**...yes, PLAY. Invite others to do the same. Thank God for your good/play time!
- Dressing appropriately** and with dignity. As Christians, we represent Christ, not culture.
- Become involved** in the various ministries in our parish. We need Mass ministers: Sacristans, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Ushers. Children.....we need altar servers-yes, you are needed too! Learn our faith by sharing it as a catechist in our religious education program!

Faith, Freedom, and the Future of Our Nation

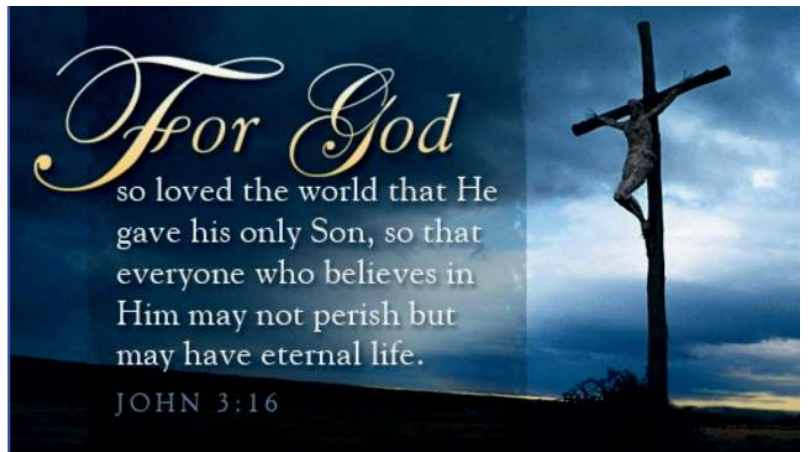
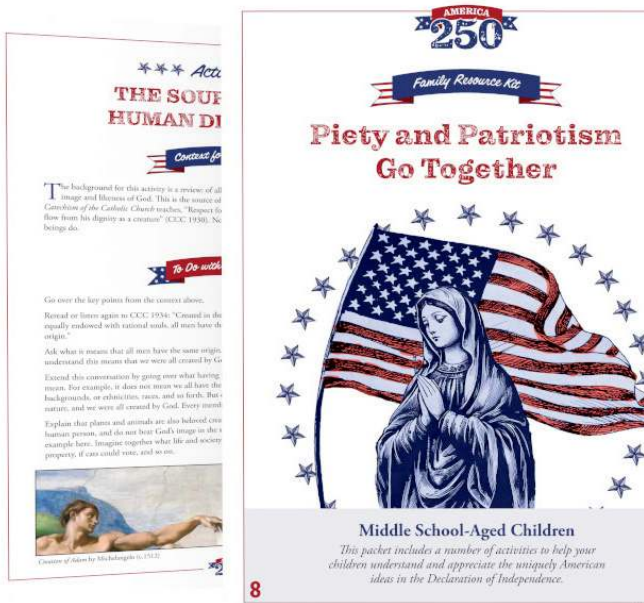
This year, our nation marks 250 years since the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY LIFE, THE UNIVERSE, AND EVERYTHING

Why does God love us so much? And why are we able to love others? The answer to these questions is found in the meaning of today's feast. Trinity Sunday celebrates not so much an idea of three-in-one, as the relationship of the Persons of the Trinity with each other and with us. The idea of the Trinity is based on love. But God's love was so great, God went even further. God created us to be loved by God.

Though human love is not perfect, the love of man and woman can produce another person, a child. The three Persons of the Trinity share one life in God. But through baptism we also share in God's life. Just as parents love to see how their children look like them, so God loves to see the divine in us.

Our decision to love is a response to God's love, and our ability to love is itself a gift from God. The meaning of life, the universe, and everything is Love, the love of the Trinity for each other and for us. The question now is, how well do we use that gift of God's love by loving each other?

Dlaczego Bóg tak bardzo nas kocha? I dlaczego jesteśmy zdolni kochać innych? Odpowiedź na te pytania odnajdujemy w znaczeniu dzisiejszego święta. Niedziela Trójcy Świętej celebruje nie tyle ideę „trzech w jednym”, ile relację Osób Trójcy Świętej między sobą oraz z nami. Idea Trójcy opiera się na miłości. Ale miłość Boga była tak wielka, że poszedł On jeszcze dalej — stworzył nas, abyśmy byli przez Niego kochani.

Choć ludzka miłość nie jest doskonała, miłość mężczyzny i kobiety może wydać na świat kolejną osobę — dziecko. Trzy Osoby Trójcy Świętej dzielą jedno życie w Bogu. Jednak przez chrzest również my uczestniczymy w życiu Boga. Tak jak rodzice z radością dostrzegają podobieństwo swoich dzieci do siebie, tak Bóg raduje się, widząc w nas to, co boskie.

Nasza decyzja, by kochać, jest odpowiedzią na Bożą miłość, a sama zdolność do kochania jest darem od Boga. Sensem życia, wszechświata i wszystkiego jest Miłość — miłość Trójcy Świętej między sobą i do nas. Pozostaje więc pytanie: jak dobrze wykorzystujemy ten dar Bożej miłości, kochając siebie nawzajem?

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION



Baptism: Baptisms are scheduled on the second Sunday of each month. Polish Baptisms are at 1:00 p.m., and English Baptisms are at 1:30 p.m. Please contact the Faith Formation Office before booking a venue for the celebration. Parents must be registered with our parish. Both sponsors must be over 16 years old, with at least one being a practicing Catholic.



Marriage: The bride and groom should be active members of our parish. The couple should contact the Faith Formation Office at least six months in advance to schedule their marriage, allowing for adequate preparation. Schedule the church date for your marriage before securing your venue.



Funerals: The family of the deceased will coordinate with the chosen funeral home. The funeral home will then contact us at Our Mother of Good Counsel about the upcoming funeral Mass. We will then get in touch with the family to organize the funeral liturgy.



Eucharist for the Homebound and Hospitalized: If you are unable to attend Mass please contact the Parish Office for the Sacraments of the Eucharist. Our Homebound ministry would be happy to assist you.



Anointing of the Sick & Hospital Visits: Please contact the Parish Office if your loved one requires an anointing. Please do not wait until death is imminent to request anointing, as it may take some time to find a priest for the sacrament.



Religious Education: We offer religious education classes for grades 1-8. Call the Faith Formation Office for more information. Classes meet Wednesday, 6:00-7:30PM September through March.
