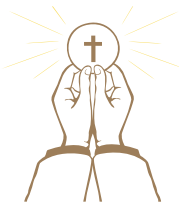

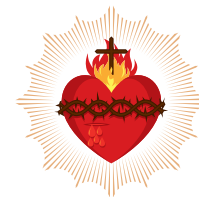

A WORD FROM FR. GREG

We are moving forward into the warmer summer months! To begin, I would like to thank everyone who participated in the Corpus Christi procession last weekend. We were blessed to have beautiful weather as we brought the True Body of Christ out into the world.

Special thanks to the King Casimir the Great and Adam Mickiewicz Polish Schools for preparing the altars and participating in the procession with their families. I also thank the members of the Ludzmierz and Szaflary Circles for preparing the remaining altars. The Polish pastoral team did a wonderful job coordinating and organizing the entire event.

I want to express gratitude to the members of the Zaskale, Ludzmierz, Szaflary, and Wróblówka Circles for their flags that represent their communities. Thank you to the Highlander musicians for their talents, and to all who wore their traditional *Góral* attire. Many sincere thanks to those who carried the canopy over the Blessed Sacrament, everyone who carried processional flags and religious images, and all who walked in the procession.

As our Lord circled our church grounds, the procession was led by the crucifix, followed by multiple flags representing the papacy, our countries, and specific groups. Because this Sunday is National Flag Day, it is a fitting time to reflect on the significance of these symbols. A flag is much more than a piece of cloth; it is a visual declaration of identity, unity, and allegiance. When we bear these

flags behind the Cross, it illustrates our priorities. It reminds us that while we are proud citizens of our nation and active members of our earthly communities, our ultimate allegiance belongs to Christ. We bring our whole lives, our patriotism, our heritage, and we place them communally under the banner of our Lord.

We are also settling back into the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. You have likely noticed that the green vestments and altar cloths have returned to the sanctuary. It is easy to hear the word "ordinary" and think of this season as mundane or unremarkable, but in the Church, the term actually comes from the word "ordinal," meaning numbered weeks.

More importantly, the color green symbolizes life, hope, and spiritual growth. After the mountaintop experiences of Lent, Easter, and Pentecost, Ordinary Time is our season to put down deep roots. Just as the trees and gardens outside are in full bloom, this is the time for our souls to flourish.

How can we use this season fruitfully? I encourage you to look for God in the quiet, everyday moments. Spiritual growth usually doesn't happen through constant grand gestures, but through small, faithful habits. Consider using the summer's slightly slower pace to establish a consistent habit. Read the daily Gospel over your morning coffee, pray the Rosary on an evening walk, or sit in silence with God for five minutes a day. Maybe your schedule now allows you to join us at morning mass? Let us use this "ordinary" season to allow God to work extraordinary, quiet transformations in our lives.

Drodzy Parafianie,

Mam nadzieję, że wszyscy dobrze się mają, gdy wkraczamy w cieplejsze miesiące letnie. Na początku chciałbym serdecznie podziękować wszystkim, którzy wzięli udział w procesji Bożego Ciała w ubiegły weekend. Zostaliśmy pobłogosławieni piękną pogodą, gdy nieśliśmy Najświętszy Sakrament pośród naszej wspólnoty, dając publiczne świadectwo naszej wiary i miłości do Chrystusa obecnego w Eucharystii.

Szczególne podziękowania kieruję do Polskich Szkół im. Króla Kazimierza Wielkiego oraz Adama Mickiewicza za przygotowanie ołtarzy i udział w procesji wraz z rodzinami. Dziękuję również członkom Koła Ludzmierz oraz Koła Szaflary za przygotowanie pozostałych ołtarzy. Polski zespół duszpasterski wykonał wspaniałą pracę, koordynując i przygotowując całe wydarzenie.

Pragnę także wyrazić wdzięczność członkom Kół Zaskale, Ludzmierz, Szaflary i Wróblówka za przyniesienie sztandarów i godne reprezentowanie swoich społeczności podczas procesji. Serdeczne podziękowania kieruję również do muzyki góralskiej za piękną oprawę uroczystości oraz do wszystkich, którzy przybyli w strojach góralskich, dając świadectwo przywiązania do naszej wiary i tradycji. Dziękuję także osobom niosącym baldachim nad Najświętszym Sakramentem oraz wszystkim, którzy nieśli chorągwie, feretrony i aktywnie włączyli się w przebieg procesji.

Ołtarze ustawione na zewnątrz stworzyły przestrzeń do słuchania Słowa Bożego, modlitwy i refleksji. Dziękuję wszystkim, którzy swoją pracą, modlitwą i obecnością przyczynili się do pięknego przeżycia tej uroczystości.

Gdy nasz Pan przemierzał teren wokół kościoła, procesję otwierał krzyż, za którym podążały liczne flagi reprezentujące papieżstwo, nasze kraje oraz różne grupy i organizacje. Ponieważ w tę niedzielę obchodzimy Narodowy Dzień Flagi, jest to odpowiedni moment, aby zastanowić się nad znaczeniem tych symboli. Flaga jest czymś więcej niż tylko kawałkiem materiału; jest widocznym wyrazem tożsamości, jedności i przynależności. Kiedy niesiemy

te flagi za Krzyżem, ukazuje to nasze priorytety. Przypomina nam, że choć jesteśmy dumnymi obywatelami naszych narodów i aktywnymi członkami ziemskich społeczności, nasza najważniejsza przynależność należy do Chrystusa. Przynosimy Mu całe nasze życie, nasz patriotyzm i nasze dziedzictwo, składając je wspólnie pod sztandarem naszego Pana.

Powracamy również do okresu liturgicznego zwanego Okresem Zwykłym. Zapewne zauważyliście, że do prezbiterium powróciły zielone szaty liturgiczne oraz zielone obrusy ołtarzowe. Łatwo usłyszeć słowo „zwykły” i pomyśleć, że jest to czas mało znaczący czy pozbawiony szczególnych wydarzeń. Jednak w Kościele natura ta odnosi się do kolejnych, ponumerowanych tygodni roku liturgicznego.

Co ważniejsze, kolor zielony symbolizuje życie, nadzieję i duchowy wzrost. Po intensywnych przeżyciach Wielkiego Postu, Wielkanocy i Zesłania Ducha Świętego, Okres Zwykły jest czasem, aby zapuścić głębokie korzenie wiary. Tak jak drzewa i ogrody wokół nas rozkwitają pełnią życia, tak również nasze dusze są zaproszone do wzrostu i rozwoju.

Jak możemy dobrze wykorzystać ten czas? Zachęcam was, abyście szukali Boga w cichych, codziennych chwilach. Wzrost duchowy zazwyczaj nie dokonuje się przez wielkie i spektakularne czyny, lecz przez małe, wiernie podejmowane praktyki. Być może spokojniejsze tempo lata będzie okazją do wypracowania stałego duchowego nawyku. Można czytać codzienną Ewangelię przy porannej kawie, odmawiać różaniec podczas wieczornego spaceru lub poświęcić kilka minut dziennie na ciche trwanie przed Bogiem. Być może letni harmonogram pozwoli wam częściej uczestniczyć we Mszy Świętej w dni powszednie.

Wykorzystajmy ten „zwykły” okres, aby pozwolić Bogu dokonywać w naszym życiu niezwykłych, choć często cichych przemian. Niech ten czas będzie dla nas okazją do pogłębienia relacji z Chrystusem i wzrastania w wierze, nadziei oraz miłości.

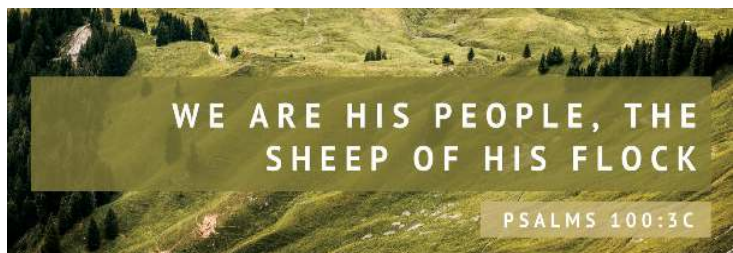

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION



Baptism: Baptisms are scheduled on the second Sunday of each month. Polish Baptisms are at 1:00 p.m., and English Baptisms are at 1:30 p.m. Please contact the Faith Formation Office before booking a venue for the celebration. Parents must be registered with our parish. Both sponsors must be over 16 years old, with at least one being a practicing Catholic.



Marriage: The bride and groom should be active members of our parish. The couple should contact the Faith Formation Office at least six months in advance to schedule their marriage, allowing for adequate preparation. Schedule the church date for your marriage before securing your venue.



Funerals: The family of the deceased will coordinate with the chosen funeral home. The funeral home will then contact us at Our Mother of Good Counsel about the upcoming funeral Mass. We will then get in touch with the family to organize the funeral liturgy.



Eucharist for the Homebound and Hospitalized: If you are unable to attend Mass please contact the Parish Office for the Sacraments of the Eucharist. Our Homebound ministry would be happy to assist you.



Anointing of the Sick & Hospital Visits: Please contact the Parish Office if your loved one requires an anointing. Please do not wait until death is imminent to request anointing, as it may take some time to find a priest for the sacrament.



Religious Education: We offer religious education classes for grades 1-8. Call the Faith Formation Office for more information. Classes meet Wednesday, 6:00-7:30PM September through March.
